SMALL GROUPS at St. Silas' vary in size, emphasis and the frequency of their meetings. What they *do* have in common is that they provide an opportunity for members to feel part of a smaller unit: to share, learn, have fun, eat, drink and socialise, to be accountable, to support and encourage one another, to study the Bible and pray together, to tease out what being a disciple of Jesus means in day-to-day life. YOUNG PEOPLE at St Silas'. There are currently two **Youth Fellowship** groups. Powerhouse 4 is an opportunity for young teens to read the bible and ask real questions about what it means to follow Jesus.

Powerhouse 3 allows older children to explore the Bible, helping them to grow in faith through a variety of activities, such as games, crafts, role-playing and music.

Powerhouse 1 & 2 includes crèche for babies. It enables babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers to enjoy fun together and learn about Jesus through creative play, music, song, prayer and stories.

Parent & Baby Area to the rear of the church offers a child-friendly space with baby changing facilities, comfy chairs for parents and lots of toys to entertain non-mobile babies or toddlers.
